

Harvest...

It's harvest time... the time for ploughing, and sowing has passed - it's time to gather the crops in!

Harvest comes as a personal reminder that every day we are individually preparing for our final harvest. Our Creator clearly teaches us in the Bible that what a man sows - that shall he also reap. Those who carefully follow His instructions experience a deeply satisfying and peaceful life despite any sorrows and difficulties they encounter. This is the clear teaching of God in the first Psalm and throughout the Bible.

Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stands in the path of sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful;

The *blessed* person is different to the ungodly because he or she is concerned to please God. The Bible is the very foundation of their lives. Every day they are guided and controlled by its teaching.

But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and in His law he meditates day and night.

What happens when dark times come along?

He shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that brings forth its fruit in its season whose leaf also shall not wither; and whatever he does shall prosper.

What about those who ignore their Creator?

The ungodly are not so, but are like the chaff which the wind drives away.

Does it matter? How important is it? The answer follows - there is a Great Separation coming:

Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.

In summary the Psalm concludes:

For the LORD knows (He lovingly approves) the way of the righteous, but the way of the ungodly shall perish.

What a contrast!
