It's good to be writing a Village circular again! This year, because of Covid, we did not send out an invitation to our anniversary services. At our Anniversary service we gave thanks to God that it is now 237 years since the Chapel was established in Five Ash Down. Two centuries is a long time yet very little compared with the 2021 years since the Son of God, the Lord Jesus Christ, came to be our Saviour. I am so glad that God decided to give us a constant reminder that the coming of His Son was such a significant event that our entire dating system would have a fresh start. The angels told the shepherds that the coming of the Lord Jesus was 'good tidings of great joy' - indeed it was and is! Our sins can be forgiven and an eternity of great happiness after this life certainly lies ahead for everyone who accepts the Lord Jesus as their Saviour!

Many people have no idea why God sent His Son into the world but the reason is clearly explained in the Bible. Because God, our Creator, is holy, sin must always be dealt with. We have all sinned and our sin must be punished - but God loved us so much that He decided that He, our God, would deal with our sin Himself by sending His Son into the world to bear the punishment we would otherwise have to suffer. This is why the Lord Jesus Christ died the terribly painful death of crucifixion. He was suffering for everyone who would believe that He bore the penalty for their sin (those who would believe in Him and want to live for Him). No wonder He is very precious to us!

One of our harvest festival hymns this year is printed opposite. The words faithfully remind us of the very serious truths God has revealed in the Scriptures about the coming final harvest and His wonderful provision for us to be reconciled to Him.
