Everything in the entire universe belongs to Him! *The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein.* It all belongs to the Baby born in Bethlehem that first Christmas.

I love the way the apostle John puts it: *He came unto His own* (the Jewish nation) *and His own did not receive Him, but as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those that believe on His name.* He became a man - so that everyone who would truly believe on Him would be a child of God forever!

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes on Him should not perish (be eternally punished for their sins) but have everlasting life.

This is the message that has been proclaimed in the Chapel for over 200 years... Please join us this Christmas and whenever you can!
